For me, it is indeed a privilege to unfold this rich decorated saga before you.

As I begin, my heart is tempered with the poignant memory of three very young, promising alumini who are no more with us. Let me pay my respects to the tender souls of Elizabeth Ignatius, Gokul Mohanan Pillai and Rohit Raj who is son of Lathika Ravi, our KG teacher. Our hearts go out to their loved ones. This year we had begun one section of Pre- KG with 10 energetic tiny tots at our KG campus, owing allegiance to the guidelines given in the National Education Policy 2020, by the govt of India. We are humbled to inform that due to the ever increasing demand for admissions, we have increased one division in class I and in Class XI science stream making the total number of divisions as 5.

FELICITATIONS TO THE HIGH ACHIEVERS OF 2021-22 BOARD EXAMINATIONS

- > Amidst the uncertainties prevailing in the academic year 2021-22, CBSE declared the results of AISSCE & AISSE examinations 2021, in the month of April and we did have a 100% pass result.
- Among the 198 students who appeared for the class X, secondary school examination, 2021-22, 154 students had received distinction, of which 10 students had A1 in all subjects. 70 students scored 90% and above overall while 39 received a first class.
- Our toppers are: Ridhi Suresh with 494/500 which is 99%
 Chris Poovathingal Ranjith with 492/500, which is 98.4%
 Abhirami C Sunilkumar with 487/500 which is 97.4%
- Coming to the Class XII results, we had a total of 209 students who appeared for the Senior School Certificate examinations 2021-22 in class XII, 141 students scored distinction of which 21 received A1 in all subjects. 53 students had scored above 90% and 61 scored first class.
- > Results of the science stream at a glance:
 - No. of students appeared 155
 - Distinction 102 students with 19 scoring A1 in all subjects
 - No. of students scoring 90% and above overall- 42
 - No. of students with first class 46
- Our toppers of science stream : Mithra Warrier scoring 490/500 that is 98%
 Anagha V B with 489/500 which is 97.8%
 Aswin T Biju with 487/500 that is 97.4%

- Among the 54 students who appeared, 39 had received distinction with 2 students receiving A1 in all subjects. 11 students scored above 90% overall while 15 received a first class.

- Today as I unveil this academic brilliance in front of you, my heart goes out to those unsung heroes behind the stage, the teachers of bhavans Poochatty. A big pranam to each one of you for the unmatched dedication and determination that helped our children reach heights.
- Now from the world of bookworms let me draw your attention to the performers outside the classrooms, on the sports field. Every year our sports team sets the field ablaze and touches new heights. This year was no exception.
- The journey began in early November when the handball team of Bhavans Poochatty emerged winners at the Thrissur Sahodaya Handball Tournament held at Blooming Buds Bethania Kunnamkulam. Rohan of class XII was adjudged the best keeper while Rohit Shankar of class XII was the top scorer. These 13 students had represented the South Zone CBSE Handball tournament held at Maharashtra and were second runner ups.

- At the 38th all kerala Dr. K M Munshi inter school atheletic meet conducted at Bhavans Vidya Mandir, Eroor, where various Bhavans schools and other reputed schools in Kerala participate, we lifted the ever rolling trophy. Alwin Biju of class X was the individual champion.
- Yet another feather on the crown, we were the overall winners of the CBSE All Kerala Atheletic Meet held at Kozhikode University Stadium late December. 48 students had participated in the event from which 29 had qualified for the National level athletic meet.
- ➤ The Nationals team had an outstanding and memorable stint at Varanasi where they made us proud by winning the aggregate trophy for the under 17 boys as well as 2nd and 3rd positions in various events for the under 17 & 19 girls category.
- Winning and excelling has become a habit for the physical education department of Bhavans Poochatty and the students they mentor. I take this opportunity to applaud and appreciate the efforts taken by Smt. Minimol & Sri Victor Raphael who leads the team from the forefront along with sri Midhun and smt Sajitha, the new bees who have given significant support. Sabitha Gokul Post graduate teacher of informatics practices at our school.

- 'Arts teach us how to breathe'.... Said Ray Bradbury. Bhavans Poochatty has always placed great store on developing creativity amongst the students, particularly fine arts. Devamitra A R of class XII bagged first in water colouring ,Oil painting & clay modeling at the District level CBSE youth festival and a prestigious first prize for clay modeling, second prize for water colouring and Oil painting at the state level CBSE youth festival. She also secured first prize at the All kerala inter Bhavans cultural and literary competition held at Eroor Bhavans for oil painting and clay modeling. Her mentors at school, Smt. Latha Devi and Smt. Radhalakshmi have made sure this talented young girl excels in all her ventures. Unfortunately she will be an ex- bhavanite next year as her guru, Latha Devi teacher.
- ➤ We had the honour to produce a TED X speaker this year. Steve Mathews of class XI was selected to present his views on the topic mental issues prevailing in our community, at the TEDx youth 2023 summit conducted by Bharatiya Vidya Bhavans, Raipur.
- At the inter school and college Mathematics Quiz competition 2022- 23 organized by St. Joseph's college Irinjalakuda, where 66 schools and colleges in Kerala participated, Deepak Menon of class XI & Fathima Nasnin of class XII won third prize.
- At the inter school science exhibition held at bhavans irinjalakuda our team comprising Deepak Menon of class XI and Nihal B Krishnan of class IX won the first prize and were selected for the regional level CBSE science exhibition. - Awareness program on the menace caused by drugs and illicit trafficking was conducted for classes 11 and 12 by Mr. Sajeevan, excise officer on 28th June.
- Free eye test camp was conducted by Arya eye care Hospital, Thrissur for students and staff from July 4th to 7th.

- Guru leads you from darkness to light., visible to invisible and material to divine. In order to restore the essence of Guru into the minds of the younger generation, we celebrated Guru Poornima on July 13th. The most renowned Guru and visionary Sri Chitran Namboothiripad had graced the occasion.

- > Sargalaya 2022, the literary and cultural festival was conducted with zeal and vigor on 25,26 & 27 August where talent, creativity and sportsmanship were celebrated.
- > On 29th August, the National Sports Day, around 100 students participated in the 6Kms cross country race commemorating sportsmanship and brotherhood in the field of sports.
- Annual Sports Meet 2022 -23 was conducted on 31st August & 1st September. Rain Gods had blessed us abundantly during these two days, causing apprehension of completion of the event. But for the students, come rain or sunshine the energy and enthusiasm for sports precedes any other, and with that energy in air, we completed the event successfully.
- This year our class XII students participated in the Model United Nations at Nirmala Matha Central School, Thrissur. One of the much acclaimed and promoted conclaves of CBSE for the students, The Model United Nations summit is gaining popularity along these parts of the state. This year, we had sri. Suramnath and team who demonstrated Rajasthani folk dance for our students.
- > On November 1st, the Kerala Piravi day, Bhavans Poochatty joined hands with the Nadathara Panchayat to be part of the NO Drugs Campaign initiated by the govt. of Kerala. Our students took oath to keep themselves away from this social menace.
- > In the Thrissur district CBSE kalotsav, and Kids fest organized by the Thrissur Sahodaya, our students had shown commendable performance and had brought laurels in the literary as well as cultural competitions.
- Anavaran 2023, the arts and science exhibition conducted on 21st January, 2023, revealed the revolutionary ideas of the Einsteins and Picassos in the making. The event also strongly affirmed the enthusiasm of collaboration as all the students right from class 4 to 11 participated, of course with the effective hand holding by the teachers. Science, Mathematics, Social Sciences, Information and technology, Linguistics, performance, Art, craft & photography are the various areas in which students had carved out a niche for themselves.
- Many counseling sessions on adolescent issues, social media addiction were given to students of class 7 to 12. Also, a session on parenting was also given by Dr.Kurien Puramadom, Director of Pope John Paul II institute of Counselling and Psychotherapy, Kozhikode.
- Bidding farewell to the class XII batch of academic year 2022-23 was a solemn function were the teachers, passed on the lamp, shining with the

light of hope and prosperity, to the students. We wish all of them the best for their upcoming board exams.

- > Teacher empowerment have always been one of the prime routine at Bhavans. The Bhavans Thrissur management have been gracious enough to bear the expenses and send the teachers for various capacity building programs organized by CBSE and Thrissur Sahodaya, so as to meet the 50 hours of training program per year mandated for teachers by CBSE.
- This academic year various clubs had functioned constructively in tune with the academic activities. The skills and interests of students in various areas right from gardening to photography, dance to scientific temper was ignited as they got involved in the club activities. The teacher in charges along with the members visited various places that complimented the nature of the club. Environment club had converted a barren land nearby into a vegetable garden and had harvested veggies last month. Science club conducted quiz competitions and observed Tesla Day , National space week etc . Photography club conducted a photography exhibitions of the students and by renowned wild life photographer couple who are our parents as well.
