# New Beginnings 2024-25

- ➤ Bharatiya Vidya Bhavans Poochatty has been relentless in providing quality education to its students for past 46 years. Every year we had to restrict our admissions at a certain number due to the infrastructural limitations. Our parent concern, The Bhavans Thrissur Kendra has been gracious enough to begin the construction of a new building at the premises which intends to host 20 class rooms, laboratories and other modern amenities. The project needs a lot of backing from the parents and alumni to come to its fruition. Let me express my heartfelt gratitude at this juncture to our beloved Chairman sri Pattabhiraman for donating Rs.1 crore for the project.
- In order to cater to the increasing demand for strengthening the competitive skills of the students aiming to crack engineering and medical entrance examinations, Bhavans Poochatty has collaborated with Brilliant coaching centre, Pala in providing comprehensive integrated coaching for the students aspiring for IITs and AIIMs. We currently have 40 focused students in our engineering batch and 34 in the medical batch.
- ➤ Bhavans Poochatty, owing allegiance to National Education Policy 2020 and National Curricular Frame work 2023, has been focusing on a more skill based curriculum by adding a hands on project work every week to students of classes 5 to 9. Here, all the technical and theoretical concepts in Science are converted to practical activities that can in turn be applied in their day to day life.

- We have turned a new leaf in our quest to promote Sanskrit language and its rich culture, as we hosted the 'Sanskritolsavam' and conducted competitions that are hardwired to the language. Around 200 students from 11 schools under CBSE and State syllabus participated in the event that was inaugurated by Guruvayur Devaswom Chairman Dr.V K Vijayan. Bhavans Poochatty emerged as overall winners. We intend to broaden the scope of the event in the coming year.
- ➤ Holistic Progress card, a novel concept put forward in NCF 2023, aims at the overall progress of the child above their academic progress. We have introduced Holistic Progress card this year for the foundational stage that is pre-kg to class 2. This will be steadily introduced in the rest of the classes from next academic year.

## FELICITATIONS TO THE HIGH ACHIEVERS OF 2023-24 BOARD EXAMINATIONS

- CBSE declared the results of class XII and X board examinations 2023, in the month of April and our students gave us an 100% pass result.
- Among the 170 students who appeared for the class X, secondary school examination, 2023-24, 134 students had received distinction, 15 students had A1 in all subjects. 59 students scored 90% and above overall, 32 received a first class and 4 second class.
- ➤ Our toppers are: Chris George and Ameya Madhavan who secured 493/500 which is 98.6% securing first position, they have also made us proud by becoming the third toppers in the Thrissur Sahodaya merit awards among the 100+ schools in Thrissur. Madhav Nair with 492/500 which is 98.4% securing second position and Diya Elizabeth Reji with 491/500 with 98.2% standing at the third position.
- Coming to the Class XII results, we had a total of 230 students who appeared for the Senior School Certificate examinations 2023-24 in class XII, 170 students scored distinction of which 17 received A1 in all subjects. 46 students had scored above 90%, 59 scored first class and 1 student received second class.

- It goes without saying that the commitment and hardwork of the teachers have been instrumental in achieving these outstanding academic results alongside the efforts of the students. Hats off to the dedicated team of teachers of Bhavans Poochatty.

- A four-day training camp was conducted for teachers in the month of April by team Resorcio on core strength building and improving collaboration. The team also conducted an orientation for parents and students on stress management and exam hacks in the month of December.
- The National Integration Camp is a prestigious personality development camp conducted by Bhavans Shikshan Bharathi, Mumbai. Last year it was conducted at Bhavan's Eroor, Ernakulam in the month of May. 6 students along with team leader Mr. Pramod had attended the camp.
- ➤ World environment day was celebrated on June 5<sup>th</sup> by planting saplings and an oath to protect them. Students of class 6 presented an exhibition on sustainable food systems that proclaimed how junk eating can be replaced with healthy diets. A debate on 'say no to single use plastics' was conducted for class 9 students and a quiz for the primary students on the topic 'Rivers in India'
- ➤ Kerala Hindi Prachar Sabha conducts 'Sugama Hindi examination' state wise every year to promote the national language. Students of our school had secured maximum points for the year 23-'24. The award function was conducted in the month of June in the school auditorium and was inaugurated by honourable Mayor sri M K Varghese.

- On June 19<sup>th</sup>, the national reading day, we had honoured Ms. Remadevi PGT Mathematics and Ms. Sneha our ayah chechi for quality use of library and maximum books read. This practice have increased the library use of staff and students equally. Students presented book reviews in the assembly. DC books conducted a book fair and interactive session for class 11 students on the importance of reading. Class libraries for primary and middle school were inaugurated.
- In order to support the higher secondary students on career opportunities, many career orientation sessions were conducted. A few to mention are MAP Education and Visa Services Australia about career in Australia, Exclusive session to commerce students by Sri Amal Unnikrishnan who passed CA at the age of 22.
- ➤ Our students of class 9 conducted a rally against drug abuse and to spread awareness of the ill effects of using drugs in the areas in and around Poochatty on 26<sup>th</sup> June to mark the International day against drug abuse and illicit trafficking. Also, the senior civil police officer, Kerala police academy, Thrissur, sri Arun K conducted anti-drug awareness class for the students. Sri Arun is with us today. A proud aluminus of Bhavans Poochatty whom we will be honouring today.
- The investiture ceremony for the school council was yet another solemn occasion where the students stood out as role models and recognized their potential as leaders. School Captain, Vice Captain and other prefects where sworn in by Lieutenant Colonel Brijesh M T, National cadet corps, Kutanellur.
- ➤ Bagless day or No book day was celebrated in the Primary and middle school, when academics without books and pens were conducted through activities. This revived the interest in subjects among the students.
- Ramayana week celebrations were officially inaugurated by Sri N Hareendran Master on 20<sup>th</sup> July. In the week long celebrations, eminent Orators like Sri Rajeev Irinjalakuda, Sri Murali Puranattukara, had filled the minds of the bhavanites with tranquility and warmth with their eloquent words. Exhibition on dasapushpam was conducted. Our artists with the help of Art teacher, Ms. Anu Henry and Malayalam Hod Smt. Geetha P S drew the essence of Ramayana in a long cloth canvas and displayed it.
- In continuation to our collaboration with AFS India which is an international, voluntary, non-governmental, non- profit organization that provides intercultural learning opportunities and exchange programs for the students, we had conducted an online internship program called 'YouVah' along with students of schools around the world which are members of AFS. 21 students had enrolled for the same and have completed the training process.
- Annual Sports Meet 2024 -25 was conducted on 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> of August was inaugurated by Sri Victor Manjila, veteran goal keeper of Indian football team and coach.
- Our children received an international exposure when they participated in the Indian International Model United Nations Championship Conference 2024 held at Ambi valley city, Mumbai in the month of August and also the one held at Choice school, Cochin, two weeks back. They had an opportunity to interact and express their thoughts with great minded individuals in India and abroad.
- Our students and teachers participated in various district and state level competitions of Thrissur Sahodaya like teachers Kalotsav, students kalotsav, kids fest and All Kerala Bhavans Fests. They had brought laurels in various areas of literal and performing arts.

- Sargalaya 2024, the literary and cultural festival was conducted with zeal and vigor on 22, 23 and 24<sup>th</sup> August where talent and creativity was celebrated.
- ➤ The extra mile education and training wing had conducted a National level contest for handwriting drawing and colouring where more than 400 students had participated from our school and won prizes.
- The All-Kerala Bhavans Gita Chanting competition was held on 26<sup>th</sup> August at the Thrissur kendra where students from various Bhavans schools across the state had participated. Bhavans Poochatty stood second with one point less than the winning team, Bhavans Girinagar.
- As a part of quality assessment, the Bhavans Shikshan Bharathi sector, Mumbai Kendra conducts an academic and administrative inspection in all Bhavans schools every year to assure quality teaching learning practices which are aligned with the recommendations of government of India and CBSE. This year too we had the inspection on 3<sup>rd</sup> September led by smt. Usha, Education officer, Shikshan Bharathi and few senior subject teachers from various schools around. The team applauded efforts put in by the management and staff of Bhavans Poochatty in the said areas.
- ➤ The students of School of Drama and fine arts conducted a story telling performance for our children on 10<sup>th</sup> September.
- In the quest to prevent suicidal tendencies among the students and improve self-love, the special education department on the anti suicidal day, began project 'Message of Hope'. As a part of this, few black boards were installed around the school. Children and teachers wrote positive quotes and feedbacks about themselves on the boards.
- ➤ Kathakali rangavatharanam, conducted by eminent artists of Kerala Kalamandalam in association with Thrissur Kathakali club at the school auditorium was a novel experience for the students. Demonstration was done by Sri Peesappilly Rajiv, a veteran Kathakali artist.
- A lecture and hands on training sessions regarding Pre-Hospital Emergency Medical care was conducted for students of classes 8 to 11 by Para Raksha team from Daya Hospital.
- ➤ We had the privilege to host two competitions conducted by Thrissur Sahodaya at our school this year. The Mathematics talent search examination and the Handball tournament. 64 schools around Thrissur had participated in the MTSE exam while 11 schools for the Handball tournament which was inaugurated by Sri Surendran S P , Asst Commissioner of police, Ollur, and the valedictory function by veteran footballer sri C V Pappachan.
- A session on 'age appropriate sex education for children and A-Z of sexual abuse' was conducted for students of classes 6 and 7. The session was conducted by Anoop C D, consultant psychologist, Adapt Centre for mental health and rehabilitation, Perumpilavu.
- In order to spread awareness on cyber security, a session was conducted by Sri Faisal R N, sub inspector of Police, cyber crime police station, Thrissur to the secondary students.

  Students also spoke in the assembly on the various loop holes that may lead to cyber crimes.
- ➢ Joining hands for a greater good 'Together for Thrissur' a flag ship program initiated in 23-24 academic year to support around 25 under privileged families in Nadathara panchayat continued to happen this year too with the support of the benevolent parent community of Bhavans Poochatty.
- ➤ Kalavatika The art integrated exhibition was conducted on 13<sup>th</sup> December where we saw how creativity intertwines with science, technology, commerce and culture. students had

- beautifully showcased their understanding of a subject through various art forms. The rare occasions when the proverb 'child is the father of man 'truly holds good.
- Innovation fest 2025, an inter school Robotics competition and workshop was conducted at our school were many students of primary and middle school had emerged winners.
- ➤ ISRO in association with Vigjnana Bharathi had conducted a mobile space exhibition, Space on Wheels at our campus. Housed within a bus, it featured detailed models of ISRO's launch vehicles, satellites and communication systems. Children were initiated to the world of space and about India's space endeavours.
- ➤ 18 students from our school participated in the students connect program conducted by IIT Madras. Students got an exposure to the facilities and provisions in the campus and received training on selected topics.
  - In addition to the above, All national and internationally acknowledged important days are observed and celebrated. These events inculcate sense of solidarity and harmony among the students.
  - Various clubs that nurture and promote interests in activities beyond academics functioned constructively this year too and complimented the academic pursuits.
- > This report included only the major highlights of the happenings in the academic year 2024-25 as I may not be able to unfold the entire inventory of activities and achievements within the given time.
- As I conclude this report, I must mention the names of few graceful people of our staff, who are retiring this year. Smt. Belseena Oliver, our KG in charge, has been part of Bhavans family for a whooping 41years. Usha Sudhish, KG teacher, Sri Suresh Kumar A P, office staff, and ayah chechees Smt Beena C D and Smt Beena Davis. They are leaving after serving the institution for more than 30 years. I know for sure, retirement is merely from their work, and that they have so much more to do as they step back into life.
